At Le Fevre High School we believe that students individual educational and wellbeing needs are a priority.

We work with our students, families and the community to ensure we deliver high quality education with a focus on wellbeing for learning. Our students are challenged and flourish because each child's passions, talents and gifts are embraced and nurtured. Le Fevre High School is a school with an outstanding, well qualified, passionate and dedicated team. Learning thrives because the wellbeing of students and teachers is a high priority.

Our values of care, commitment, co-operation and respect underpin our commitment to providing young people with high quality teaching and learning programs in engaging and supportive environments.

WELLBEING FOCUS

Le Fevre High School has high expectations and acknowledges that positive wellbeing is key to learning. We provide support for all students to realise their potential.

In 2022 our school became a Resilience Project school which is a wellbeing curriculum that not only drives our Pastoral Care Program but continues to support teachers and students in every lesson. This curriculum emphasizes the need for students, staff and parent community to practice daily moments of gratitude, empathy and mindfulness.

The school has a comprehensive year 6 to 7 transition program to support students to transition to high school as well as develop resilience and a sense of personal responsibility. We work closely with our local primary schools to ensure that we are familiar with individual student learning and wellbeing needs.

At Le Fevre High School we have a dedicated Aboriginal Education team to support Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. There is a Wellbeing team comprised of youth workers, support staff, wellbeing leaders and leaders committed to supporting all students in their day to day school experience.

To be inclusive of all student interests we have a diverse range of alternative programs including sports, construction and wellbeing focus.

Current students from across the year levels have established a vibrant Student Parliament that inputs into school decisions through representation on the Governing Council.

LEARNING FOCUS

Le Fevre High School is committed to the provision of a world-class education for all students.

The school has modern facilities and centres for visual arts, home economics, physical education, languages, STEM teaching and the performing arts. Our performing arts program includes dance, drama and music each with dedicated purpose-built facilities within our Performing Arts Centre.

We also have a gymnasium, oval access and longstanding arrangements with neighbouring sporting clubs to use their playing facilities for the delivery of a comprehensive physical education and sports program.

Our resource centre, in conjunction with our ICT resources, provides students with access to a broad and wide-ranging collection of physical and online resources. The school also has outstanding facilities that offer trade pathways, advanced skills industry pathways and Maritime pathways.

The South Australian Maritime High School Program is based at Le Fevre High School. The school has well established partnerships with the Australian Maritime College and the Australian Fisheries and Maritime Academy. This program is designed to increase the number of students pursuing careers in a diversity of maritime industries and provide our students with increased opportunities to pursue the study of the sciences, technology, engineering and mathematics.

MIDDLE SCHOOL

Students in the middle years are experiencing a profound transition from childhood to adolescence.

They are undergoing significant intellectual, social, physical, emotional, ethical and moral development. These are the years when experiencing positive relationships, being genuinely engaged in learning and developing high self-esteem have a major and lasting impact on each young person.

The features of our middle school structure promote an inclusive school community and positive mental health and wellbeing for all community members. LFHS understands that Gratitude, Empathy and Mindfulness promote a sense of belonging for students, staff and families. When students feel included and connected they will be more likely to participate in the school community and achieve academic success. Care Groups provide an important platform for the development of these relationships.

Our middle schooling model fosters learning environments support successful transition for students as they move from primary into high school.

LFHS provides students in years 7, 8 and 9 with a deep and personalised connection with a team of teachers who deliver the Resilience Project, english, mathematics, science, humanities and social sciences, and is complemented by a wide range of additional subjects. We aim to provide opportunities for every child to achieve success in all subjects and explore personal strengths through a diverse curriculum.

SENIOR SCHOOL

Le Fevre High School students in the senior years are emerging young adults with a diverse range of needs and aspirations.

We are whole heartedly committed to supporting students achieve their personal, academic and career goals by providing a challenging, relevant and flexible curriculum for students to ultimately achieve their SACE (South Australian Certificate of Education). The senior school provides a range of learning opportunities for students in years 10 to 12, allowing them to pursue their own interests and gain entry to tertiary education, vocational training and employment.

During senior schooling, students engage deeply in the career development aspect of the school's Pastoral Care Program. Students are provided with opportunities to participate in work placements to help inform potential career decisions.

In the Senior school, students have the opportunity to make academic choices to customise their school program to develop the skills, knowledge and understandings required for their future pathways and directions. We offer a comprehensive vocational pathways program, supporting students career development and preparing students for life beyond school.

Features of the Senior School include:

- Developing positive and mutually respectful relationships with all teaching staff and members of the school community
- A designated Senior Learning Centre
- Care Group and Pastoral Care Program, including The Resilience Project and Career Education
- Access to an array of subjects both on and off campus.
- Flexible timetable structures to support students pursuing VET programs, School Based Apprenticeships and Flexible Learning Options
- Supportive, safe and caring learning environment which encourages high achievement of all students
- Access to and support from a comprehensive leadership team, including the Senior School Leader, Wellbeing Assistant Principal, Learning and Engagement Leaders and Care Group Teachers
